## Blog #122: View from the Heavens Auditorium Theatre, Chicago




Great architecture can take your breath away. Especially when you can get a bird's eye view of the whole building.

Chicago's Auditorium Theatre is a architectural treasure. A National Historic Landmark known internationally for its perfect acoustics, it was designed as a theatre, office block and hotel. Designed by Adler and Sullivan, it opened in 1889, using the most modern technology at the time, including electric lighting and air conditioning.

I was fortunate to take one of the building tours offered by the Auditorium Theatre, when took us all the way into the upper balcony. That's where I captured the photo, using a technique of photo stitching where I take a series of individual photographs and then merge them into the final image:

I then then used the distinctive lights above the theatre to create a border around the image.



## **TAKEAWAYS**

- 1. Check out city tours and tours offered by landmark buildings for a great way to see and photograph great architecture.
- 2. Keep and eye out for unusual angles not regularly seen (e.g., rooftops, looking down from taller buildings, and staircases).

- 4. Look for distinctive features (e.g., light panels) to customize photos.
